## Timetable

## Assessment

### Year 12 SCS Examination:

**Week 9 will be the Year 12 Social and Community Studies examination:**

**Group A – Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March (next Tuesday)**

**Group B – Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March (Next Friday)**

According to the BUSY Schools assessment policy and the Academic Integrity regulations by QCAA, students who are absent on the day of the exam have to provide either a medical certificate or evidence of occurrence of some other extenuating circumstances. Parents will

need to inform the school as soon as possible if there is such a reason for a student not being able to attend. In the event that a student is not in attendance on the day and has not supplied any evidence, they will be given no rating, and this will void all other marks in that subject for the year. It is imperative that all students are in attendance for their exam period.
