## Curriculum Update

Happy Spring! It's hard to believe the end of Term 3 is next week. It has been a very productive term, and the students are starting to realise that they have nearly completed Year 11, which is an amazing milestone in their learning journey. Next week, we are allocating time on Monday and Tuesday afternoon to support students' complete assessments for Unit 1 in Essential English and Essential Mathematics and Module 1 in Social and Community Studies, by completing these assessments to a C (or above) standard, students will remain QCE eligible. In week 10 you will be emailed a snapshot of how your young person is tracking in each of their subjects.

### Term 4 New Curriculum Program – BRAKE Driver Awareness Program

During Term 4 'power hour' every Monday and Tuesday afternoon, BUSY Schools will be delivering the BRAKE driver awareness program on campus to all students. The program educates young adults about road risks with an award-winning, eight-part resilience training program that can save young lives. There are five aspects to the BRAKE program – **B**ehaviour, **R**isk, **A**ttitude, **K**nowledge and **E**ducation. BUSY Schools has received some government funding to deliver the course and successful completion accrues 1 credit toward a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).
