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A note from the Campus Principal

Dear Parents, Carers, Students and School Community,

We have now come to the end of term 1 and I would like to thank the staff for all the support they provide to our young people everyday. I would also like to thank our parents and carers for their support in what is usually a busy and difficult term 1 as students adjust to a new learning environment and more challenging work. Together, we have made it through the term and our students should be proud of their achievements so far.

Our Year 12 students have only 27 weeks left of their senior education before they graduate. I strongly encourage Year 12 students to be constantly checking with their teachers to ensure they are on track and accepting the additional support that is on offer to complete assessments.

I would also like to remind all students about the importance of attending their vocational courses. The assessment in vocational courses is competency-based and students need to attend and complete all assessments to be deemed competent. They must achieve competency in every module, or their certificate will not be awarded, and they will not receive the QCE credit points that go with it. All students are relying on completing vocational courses to receive credit points to gain the QCE. Without these credit points, students won't be able to achieve the QCE. Please check with your vocational provider (RTO) regarding your progress and make sure you are on track. If you are not on track, ask the trainers what you must do to successfully complete the course.

Non-State Schools Transport Assistance Scheme (NSSTAS)

Under the Non-State Schools Transports Assistance Scheme, there are two programs that parents/carers can apply for assistance for students transport costs:

- Bus Fare Assistance Program (BFAP)
- Students With Disabilities (SWD)

Applications are available online during the month of May for Semester One and October for Semester Two. Please see further information attached to this edition of the newsletter for assistance on how to apply.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a wonderful term 1 break and I hope you have a great Easter with family and friends. Term 2 will commence on April 17.


Art Class
