I have been teaching at BUSY School since Term 3 last year. Year 12 Essential English

Well, that's a wrap for Semester 1 and what a semester it's been. After completing the CIA in week 6 we have been watching Australian popular culture films in preparation for our term 3 movie comparison vlog. We have watched 'Tomorrow When the War Began' and 'The Black Balloon', students have also had the opportunity to choose an Australian film of their choice from our Clickview playlist. Next term students will begin Unit 4: Representations and Popular Culture Texts. In Unit 4, students explore how the text structures, language features and language of contemporary popular culture texts shape meaning. The unit is made up of two topics:

- Responding to popular culture texts
- Creating representations of Australian identities, places, events and concepts.

While exploring popular culture texts (movies and short stories) students will apply a range of comprehension strategies to make meaning of the texts studied, students will also create texts of their own in the form of a vlog and a short story.

We hope you have a great break, and we look forward to seeing you next term. As always if you have any questions or queries, please do not hesitate to contact the Essential English teaching staff.



Employers may have high expectations, but they don't necessarily need experience from young people. However, they do require...



Jaidyn is assisting the elderly at Blue Care.










