Mobile Phone Policy

Earlier this week I sent home a letter to parents and students outlining the policy on the use of mobile phone use at school.

Mobile phones often create disruptions and distractions in classrooms. Establishing a 'mobile phone-free zone' helps teachers to establish and maintain a focused and productive teaching learning environment. The purpose of attending school is to learn to assist in gaining employment and becoming an effective citizen. Below are the key elements of the mobile phone policy:

- Students will be required to switch their phones to silent and store phones securely in the boxes during class times.
- Families should contact the school office should you need to pass an urgent message to your children.
- Students who do not follow the mobile phone policy will have their phones confiscated until the end of the school day.
- Persistent refusal to comply with the mobile phone policy may result in disciplinary action.

I am seeking the support of parents/carers to acknowledge and follow the Mobile phone Policy as agreed upon at enrolment.
