Firstly, I would like to welcome students, parents, and staff to term 3! It has already been a busy start to the term with several events taking place over the past two weeks. One event that I was fortunate enough to attend with some Year 12 students from the Student Representative Council (SRC) was to witness a cheque being presented from Officeworks. Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

Over the past few weeks and in the coming days, the school has been working with students and parents to develop Education Adjustment Plans (EAP) or Individual Learning Plans (ILP) for students. The purpose of these plans is to develop inclusive strategies to enable students with disabilities or learning difficulties to participate in learning experiences on the same basis as a student without a disability. During this term, the school will be counting students in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. A fact sheet for parents, guardians, and carers is attached for further information. Parents and carers are encouraged to read the information provided.

NAIDOC Week

NAIDOC Week this year was held over the winter break, so our students celebrated NAIDOC Week on Tuesday and Wednesday. This year we engaged Tribal Experiences to provide a cultural awareness program for students. The students participated in face painting using Earthen Paints (Ochre), traditional dance, and a didgeridoo demonstration. They also learned how traditional medicines are made and how to make a fire by rubbing sticks together.



IGNITE Youth Careers Expo

On Tuesday, a group of students participated in the annual IGNITE Youth Careers Expo held at the Logan Entertainment Centre. Students had the opportunity to explore different professions and gain further information on study options, apprenticeships, and job opportunities. Students were able to explore a range of different zones that included:

- The Beauty Zone featured mannequin heads with how-to guides for learning to braid and style hair. Students could also pin fabric to mini mannequins, creating their own fashion designs.
- TAFE Queensland Cookery Zone the cookery zone featured barista lessons and free coffee. Students were also able to decorate their own take-home cupcake.
- JMC Academy Creative Zone the creative zone hosted a music performance area, giving all a chance to practice on an instrument or sing! For the gamers, they had an innovative VR experience with gaming headsets.



Student Certificates

Congratulations to our students from term 1 who successfully completed Certificate II in Self-Awareness and Development. Each term we have approximately 20 students completing the course. Over the course of the year, there will be 60-plus students who will complete. The course runs for 10 weeks and students not only receive a Cert II qualification but also receive 4 points towards their QCE. We have a further 27 students who will commence the last course for the year next week.



Traineeship/Apprenticeship Updates



Year 12 student Jake has commenced a Heavy Diesel Mechanic Apprenticeship with Ronmac Holdings at Yatala. NCCD Fact Sheet for Parents, Guardians and Carers



FACT SHEET FOR PARENTS, GUARDIANS AND CARERS

WHAT IS THE NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year.

The NCCD is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the **Disability Discrimination** Act 1992.

Schools provide this information to education authorities.

WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED?

All schools in Australia must collect information about students with disability.

The NCCD:

- ensures that the information collected is transparent, consistent and reliable
- provides better information that improves understanding of students with disability
- allows parents, guardians, carers, teachers, principals, education authorities and government to better support students with disability.

Student with disability loading

Funding from the Australian Government for students with disability is based on the NCCD through the student with disability loading.

Students with disability who are counted in the top three levels of the NCCD (extensive, substantial and supplementary) attract the loading. Funding is based on a per-student amount at each of the three levels of additional support. The amount of the loading reflects the level of support students with disability need to participate fully in school, with higher funding for those who need higher levels of support.

Australian Government recurrent school funding is provided as a lump sum to school authorities including state and territory governments, which can then distribute the funding to their member schools according to their own needs-based arrangements.

The Government expects schools and school systems to consider their funding from all sources (ie Australian Government, state and territory and private) and prioritise their spending to meet the educational needs of all of their students, including students with disability.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE NCCD FOR STUDENTS?

The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, principals, education authorities and governments to better support students with disability at school.

The NCCD encourages schools to review their learning and support systems and processes. This helps schools to continually improve education outcomes for all students.
