Curriculum Update

Year 11 Essential English

In year 11 English this term students will create a short (4-6 minutes) Vlog including images and sound for the Sony Vlog Challenge 2023 – Inspirational Australians. The Vlog will nominate an inspirational Australian identity who has overcome adversity, demonstrated courage and inspired others. The chosen nominee will have been in the media in the past 10 years, and students will be encouraged to choose a personality explored in class. **This is due in week 8 (28th August – 1st September)**.

Year 12 Essential English

This term students are working to analyse representations of teenagers in Australian texts. Students will do a deep dive into two characters from either Heart Break High or Tomorrow When the War Began and decide what they think of the representation of their identities. Students will create a vlog where they share their findings. **This is due on the 25th of August**.

Year 11 Essential Maths

Year 11 has been doing amazing work so far. This term they started with the topic of Speed, Distance and Time for the first two weeks. In week 3, they started their <u>in-class</u> assignment (PSMT) which is based on the topic of speed/distance/time and Maps and Scales.

By now they should have completed the following writeups in their draft:

challenging questions and therefore be ready to perform well in this final semester.

- Introduction
- Observations
- Assumptions
- Mathematical Concepts

Drafts are due (End of week 6).

In week 7 they will transfer their drafts into the final copy booklet (or type it up in word) and submit this. If your young person is behind with this assignment, you will get an email regarding this. Please keep encouraging them to continue to persist with the hard work they are putting in so far.

Year 12 Essential Maths

This term the focus of Year 12 Mathematicians is preparing a sound foundation for the final Maths Unit in their formal schooling. Performing well in the *in-class* assignment during this term will take all the pressure off the final exam next term.

The topics covered this term include loans and interest, and bivariate data. We are currently working through a problem solving and modelling task that tests the concepts of interest and compound interest interestingly. By now your students will have completed their draft assignment and the effort to date will be reflected in the final mark. Under a 'C' will require a 'B' minimum (61%) to secure the required credit point for Maths in the final exam next term. Attendance is the key factor that determines successful completion of mathematics at Busy Schools Shailer Park. Turning up with an attitude to work in class will ensure that a student understands the process required to answer

Year 11 Social & Community Studies

This Term students will be completing the studies from Term 2, 'Arts in the Community'. There will be only one assessment piece this term taking the form of an Investigation, Creation of an Artwork, and a Recording of a Presentation.

The module 'Arts in the Community' has been structured around indigenous artists and how they are able to convey pride, self-esteem, identity, and intergenerational learning through their work. Your young person will have recently chosen an art form (painting/sculpture) and will also be selecting artwork from one indigenous artist to complete the investigation.

Assessment for this Term will have the following checkpoints:

- Week 1: Plan of a personal artwork
- Weeks 3: Complete artwork and persona comparison template
- Week 4: Analysis of both artworks
- Week 5: Script
- Week 6: Script and recordings
- Week 7: Self-evaluation

Year 12 Social and Community Studies

This semester in Social and Community Studies the unit is "Legally, it could be you". This module examines the civic rights and obligations of young school leavers and will undertake two assessment pieces: one a project (Term 3), and the other an exam (Term 4).

For their assessment in Term 3, students will be required to conduct research on a civic topic from a list or choose a topic that has been approved by myself. Students will then need to produce two documents:

- Either an infographic, webpage or artwork; and
- a written report

All Year 12 Social and Community Studies teachers have come up with a weekly plan to attack such a large commitment:

- Lesson 1 research from a list of supplied inquiry questions (option to make own questions as well) one section at a time (Introduction, Background, Global situation, Local situation, Conclusion)
- Lesson 2 assemble one section of each of the three documents (Introduction, Background, Global situation, Local situation, Conclusion)

We have structured a series of checkpoints that we will be working toward for the duration of the assessment and will contact you at the **drafting phase** if your young person is not on track, in **Week 6 (18th August)** of the term, ready for **submission** in **Week 8 (1st September)**.

BUSY Sisters Visit




Work Experience Update
