'Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it' (George Santayana)


This week, as part of our exploration of how individual and collective human experiences and perspectives of the world are communicated in autobiographical and biographical texts, we have begun watching Spielberg's 'Schindler's List' (1993). Given that the film is about the Holocaust and the mass persecution and genocide of six million Jews during World War Two, it isn't an easy or comfortable watch; however, all students have acknowledged the need to remember this truly horrific period of time in history and have approached the topic and all subsequent discussions sensitively, showing both maturity and compassion.

Essential Mathematics

Students have been working well over the last fortnight learning how to manage money, what it means to earn an income and pay taxes, including how to create a simple budget using ICT. Students are now moving into a new topic of time and distance and will start to focus on their upcoming assignment where they will plan a detailed trip to multiple locations including all relevant expenses.
