BUSY Schools Accessibility

All staff will be working remotely next week, and hope to have access to the school in order for the Administration staff to return on site on the 8th January, 2024. We will update you if there is any change to that. All other staff return to school on the 16th January.

Students return to school on the Week starting 22nd January on either Monday or Thursday depending on the student's school curriculum group.

Changes to BUSY Schools in 2024

In 2024, BUSY Schools staff will continue developing their skills in Restorative Practice and Trauma Informed Education. We strive to support our students holistically in order for them to complete their senior schooling and transition from Year 12 into further training or employment. The timetable in 2024 will continue to run with our Connect session from 8:30am to 9:15am allowing a positive primer to the day. Students will begin their day with their chosen activities from a selection including gym, outdoor games, board and card games, arts and crafts, ping pong, pool, yoga, chess and gardening.

The curriculum days next year will be either Monday and Tuesday (Group A) and Thursday and Friday (Group B). Student timetables may be different in 2024 as all curriculum days are decided after first ensuring all students are available to attend their VET courses. Students have seen their 2024 days, and will be able to see the timetables on Compass once we have set up 2024 classes.
