#### Social & Community Studies

We made it to the end of the year! The students did an amazing job on their exam, they all showed such resilience attempting (almost) all questions on the exam. The students showed they have some excellent money management skills to take with them into the world. It was such a joy teaching everyone this year and I am so very much looking forward to next year!

#### **STEM**

On Friday the students not only participated in the Makers Empire Advanced Manufacturing Program, they WON! Our STEM team worked with our industry partner Telwater to solve a problem for the manufacturing industry. The problem they were presented was ill fitting cup holders, and they students ideated a number of designs to create a cup holder that fits everything from a small coke can to a large Frank Green water bottle. The students competed in the Senior Secondary Category against 6 other schools including, where they won first place.

the team had to design and pitch their product and business case to a panel of industry professionals in a 'shark tank' style setting. The students excelled in all areas; their presentation was exceptional. The students explained their design process and showed all the ideations of their design. They forecasted projected costs to run the business and presented a marketing plan including logos and branding.

Their first place award was presented by Bernadette Zerba, Acting Director General of the Department of Regional Development, Manufacturing and Water. I could not be prouder of all the work that the students put into this project and how professionally they answered questions from industry partners, the judging panel and students from other schools.

Have a lovely break and enjoy your family time over the Christmas holidays - stay Safe!




#### Wellbeing & Support
