



ABOUT US

The BUSY Schools is an alternative school for Year 11 and 12 students who have disengaged from traditional education and who are looking for a different approach to senior schooling.

At The BUSY Schools, we recognise the strengths of our students and that a supportive environment can build confidence and unlock endless opportunities. At The BUSY Schools, students re-engage with education and complete school while getting a head start into employment through vocational training pathways that forms part of their curriculum.

The BUSY Schools is a part of The BUSY Group Ltd, a not-for-profit organisation that delivers a range of employment services, apprenticeship support and vocational skills training nationally. The BUSY Group network presents an extensive range of vocational training, school-based apprenticeships and traineeships, disability support, and employment support options to ensure every student is assisted in their chosen career.

Students are supported individually for their career plans by Employment Pathways Officers and Work Readiness Officers who assist with career planning; work readiness; preparing and sourcing work experience and school-based apprenticeships/traineeships.

VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

The BUSY Schools supports students to enrol in a range of vocational courses that align with their interests and career exploration goals. You are entitled to one government subsidised qualification whilst at school but you may also choose from a range of full fee programs.

BUSY SCHOOLS TO WORK

The BUSY Schools have developed a specific work readiness and employability skills program designed to help students prepare for and succeed in the world of work.

All students complete the BUSY Schools to Work program which includes:

- Information sessions covering a broad range of employability skills and topics such as:
 - Workplace Health and Safety
 - Respect, communication and workplace expectations
 - Education requirements for industry
 - Wellbeing, support and selfmanagement
- Industry compliance-based certification, for example -
 - White Card
 - First Aid and CPR

- Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA),
- Barista Course
- Working at Heights
- Blue Card
- Engagement with industry partners
 and representatives
- Trade/job taster programs that introduce students to broader career opportunities and gain basic skills and knowledge in a variety of industries.

The BUSY Schools is aware that our students come from diverse backgrounds and we've built a strong foundation of communication and support for all students and families. Our team of teachers, work readiness officers, employment pathways officers, education youth workers and teachers' aides work closely together to support the students to cope with the demands of schooling, as well as the demands that they face outside of school.

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The BUSY Schools also alleviate some of the stress that schooling can cause by supplying transport and school supplies, including uniforms to students, as well as food for breaks.

The BUSY Schools students are also supported with opportunities to regularly consult with a range of health practitioners who attend campuses regularly. This service is to provide additional collaboration with students to support their social and emotional needs and to improve opportunities for these young people to achieve their education, training, employment, health and lifestyle goals.

OUR PROGRAM

The BUSY Schools recognises the importance of providing opportunities to improve the social, educational, and employment outcomes of young people, particularly those who have disengaged or at risk of disengaging from education and not completing high school.

We are a Queensland Special Assistance School approved by the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board under the Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017.

All students develop an individualised learning plan and SET Plan in consultation with our Employment Pathways Officer, Learning Support, teaching staff and parents/carers, aligned with students' interests, strengths and ability. Students are given the opportunity to guide their own learning journeys, as well as enter into the workplace. The education program provide students at The BUSY Schools with the opportunity to work towards and achieve a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or have been identified to receive a Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA).

Students at The BUSY Schools complete three Senior subjects from the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA): Essential English, Essential Mathematics and Social & Community Studies plus additional electives/courses from a range of Vocational Education and Training courses under the Australian Qualifications Framework.

Additional subjects may be offered at different campuses as an elective based on student's needs and interests, for example, Short Courses in Literacy, Numeracy and Career Education, Applied subjects such as Visual Arts in Practice.

SUBJECTS



ESSENTIAL ENGLISH Applied (Essential) Subject

DESCRIPTION

Essential English is a subject that encourages students to recognise language and texts as relevant in their lives now and in the future and enables them to understand, accept or challenge the values and attitudes in these texts.

Essential English is suited to students who are interested in pathways beyond Year 12 that lead to tertiary studies, vocational education or work. The course promotes open-mindedness, imagination, critical awareness and intellectual flexibility.

TOPICS

- How meaning is communicated through contemporary texts
- How different perspectives, ideas, cultural assumption, attitudes, values and beliefs are communicated through textual representations of a range of human experiences.
- Presentation of community, local and/or global issues and ideas in a range of texts that invite an audience to take up positions.
- Representation of identities, places, events, concepts and issues in media text to influence an audience.



ESSENTIAL MATHEMATICS Applied (Essential) Subject

DESCRIPTION

Essential Mathematics develops students' conceptual understanding when they undertake tasks that require them to connect mathematical concepts, operations and relations.

They will learn to recognise definitions, rules and facts from everyday mathematics and data, and to calculate using appropriate mathematical processes.

A course of study in Essential Mathematics can establish a basis for further education and employment in the fields of trade, industry, business and community services. Students will learn within a practical context related to general employment and successful participation in society, drawing on the mathematics used by various professional and industry groups.

TOPICS

- Calculations
- Representing data
- Graphs
- Managing money
- Time and motion
- Data collection
- Measurement
- Loans and compound interest



SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY STUDIES Applied Subject

DESCRIPTION

Social and Community Studies aims to develop an appreciation of, and respect for, cultural diversity and encourages responsible attitudes and behaviours essential for the effective participation in the community.

This subject focuses on personal development and social skills, with emphasis placed on an individual's impact on and integration with a diverse community. Developing communication, personal, interpersonal and citizenship skills, problem-solving and decision making, resilience, self-esteem and self-confidence.

TOPICS

Schools may select four out of a choice of six topics available in the syllabus. The topics are:

Lifestyle and financial choices: students investigate making choices for their lifestyles, considering how to enact positive change for the present and the future. They explore money management for the purpose of informing their choices.

Healthy choices for mind and body: students investigate choices related to recreation, leisure, food, and nutrition from both a personal and society perspective, considering the implications of their choices.

Relationships and work environments: students investigate relationship skills and work environments. They explore social contexts, issues and perspectives related to work.

Legal and digital citizenship: students investigate aspects of Australia's legal system and its operation to develop their understanding of being active and informed citizens. They can explore key values that underpin the law.


Australia and its place in the world: students explore features of contemporary Australian society, including how Australia's international involvement continually shapes our society's composition and future outlook.

Arts and identity: students explore markers of identity as a social construct. They investigate how the arts contribute to a sense of identity and belonging for individuals, groups, and communities.



ENROLMENT PROCEDURE

The BUSY Schools are Special Assistance Schools. This means that we make an important contribution to addressing educational disadvantage by catering for students who are disengaged or at high risk of being disengaged from education.

WHO CAN APPLY?

All applicants must be between 15 – 19 years of age at the time of application and have completed Year 10 or equivalent. Each application is assessed on merit and will be complimented by a face-to-face interview with the Campus Principal.

A referral form or support letter outlining a student's disengagement needs to be submitted as part of the

enrolment process. Typically, the form is completed by a Principal, Deputy Principal or Guidance Officer (or similar roles) from the student's most previous school.
